# Two Church History Lessons

## 1. Seven Ecumenical Councils

- Council of Chalcedon (451 AD) - declared that Jesus was “fully human and fully divine.”

## 2. **William Temple**, Arch-bishop of Canterbury (late 1800's)

- “If your concept of God is wrong...the more religious you become...the more dangerous you become to yourself and to others.”

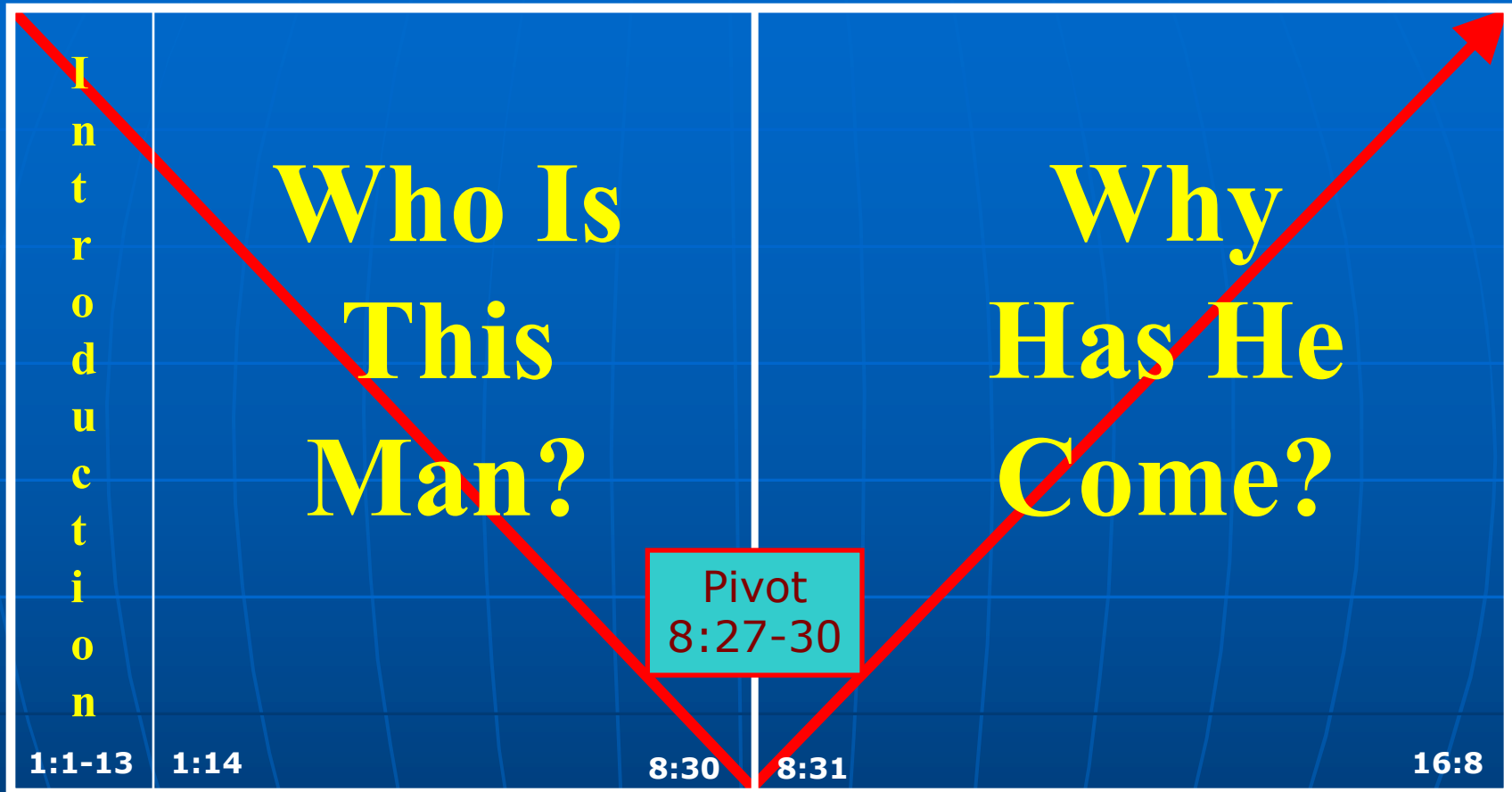

**Mark 15:33-39** And when the sixth hour had come, darkness fell over the whole land until the ninth hour. 34 And at the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?" which is translated, "My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?" 35 And when some of the bystanders heard it, they *began* saying, "Behold, He is calling for Elijah." 36 And someone ran and filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a reed, and gave Him a drink, saying, "Let us see whether Elijah will come to take Him down." 37 And Jesus uttered a loud cry, and breathed His last. 38 And the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. 39 And when the centurion, who was standing right in front of Him, saw the way He breathed His last, he said, "Truly this man was the Son of God!"
